What Isaiah Saw Isaiah 6

In Isaiah 6, the prophet Isaiah is given a vision of God seated on a majestic throne, exalted and surrounded by glory. The hem of his robe fills the temple, and mighty seraphim fly above him, declaring, "Holy, holy, holy is the Lord of hosts; the whole earth is full of his glory!" Overwhelmed by this vision of God's holiness, Isaiah realizes his own sinfulness and cries out, recognizing that he is a man of unclean lips living among unclean people. He fears being destroyed in the presence of such a holy God.

But then, a seraph touches Isaiah's mouth with a burning coal from the altar, saying, "Your guilt is taken away and your sin completely covered." This moment reveals that only God has the power to remove guilt and make people holy. Isaiah's vision of the coal points forward to a greater salvation. The rest of the book of Isaiah speaks of a Servant who would suffer so that sins could be forgiven, a virgin who would bear a son called Immanuel, and a King who would rule a never-ending kingdom of peace. This Deliverer is Jesus, whose sacrifice removes our sin and makes us clean.

TROY KIDS RECAP

In Troy Kids this week, students learned about the vision that Isaiah saw - The Big Truth from this week is this - "God is holy, and only God can make us holy."

Ask these questions below to help your students remember and reflect on the lesson:

- 1. Question: What was the prophet's job? What made it exciting? What made it hard? Why did people dislike the prophets' messages? Takeaway: The prophets were God's messengers who told God's people of God's judgment and salvation.
- 2. Question: What do the seraphim repeat three times? Is that true of anyone other than God? Why was Isaiah terrified in the presence of a holy God? Who made him clean and holy? Who can make us clean and holy? Takeaway: God is holy, and only he can make us holy.

BIG TRUTH

God is holy, and only God can make us holy.

3. **Question**: Who does Isaiah tell us is coming? What are some ways he describes him? What does he say the Savior will do? And who do we know this Savior to be? **Takeaway: Isaiah tells us God will make us holy through a coming Savior—Jesus!**
